A Brief History of Penang Hill Gallery@Egdecliff

The idea of establishing Penang Hill Gallery@Edgecliff was first initiated in 2019 by the Penang State Government and Penang Hill Corporation (PHC). Edgecliff Bungalow (originally named Breaside) was built in 1937 by a Scottish architect, J. C. Miller (1901-1988). It is distinctly perched on a cliff and can best be described as a 'box-like house that features Art Deco aesthetic'.

It was an exceptionally modern piece of architecture, far ahead of its time. There is no question that Edgecliff Bungalow was designed to be a show stopper; its enduring form and structure have withstood the test of time. It stands majestically and imposingly from every corner of the bungalow, offering dramatic views over Penang and beyond.

Today, Edgecliff Bungalow is reintroduced to the world as Penang Hill Gallery@Edgecliff. It has been carefully preserved and conserved; great extends have gone to ensuring that the builing never loses its sense of original character, personalty and identity.

The Penang State Goverment and Penang Hill Corporation have restored it into an information and education centre (the first of its kind on Penang Hill) for visitors from all over the world, especially for train enthusiasts, art lover, history buffs, researchers and the intellectually curious.
